

# Notes on The Kerry Theory

The Kerry Theory has been referred to as the Mercury Sun – Connection. What does this imply? It means that somehow, the Sun and Mercury must be connected in order for the theory to operate. Either planet by itself means nothing. It seems to me that by a simple extension of logic, for anything to happen, there must be more involved than just the Sun and Mercury. But what? Well, two more planets for starters.

So let's discuss a simple rule that meets the criteria of The Kerry Theory. Imagine that you have two planets in addition to the Sun and Mercury. For this example we will pick Saturn and Uranus. Now we have four planets, namely, Sun, Mercury, Saturn, and Uranus. Now, just as every coin has two sides (or poles, if we wish to use that term), each one of our four planets has two sides or poles. The Sun's poles are natal Sun and transiting Sun, Mercury's poles are natal Mercury and transiting Mercury, Saturn's poles are natal Saturn and transiting Saturn, and Uranus' poles are natal Uranus and transiting Uranus. The term Mercury – Sun Connection implies that we must connect the poles of all these planets in some interconnecting way for the planets' energy to be released and "cause" something to happen – at least that is my understanding of The Kerry Theory.

Let's start with an actual example. Our "test" person was born with the following natal positions:

Sun	12	ARI	51m
Mercury	28	ARI	17m
Saturn	21	GEM	17m
Uranus	05	GEM	54m

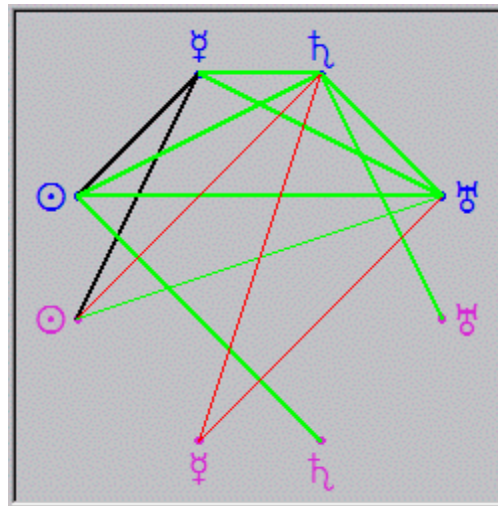
A very good day for her occurred with the transiting planets here:

Sun	28	PIS	00m
Mercury	18	PIS	37m
Saturn	14	GEM	39m
Uranus	22	LIB	00m

Let's see if we can "make the connections". Think of it like this: each planet has two poles, its natal position and its transit position. Each pole is like a transmitter/receiver that can send out and receive the energy from the other planets BUT ONLY IF THERE IS A CONNECTION. So what is a connection?

A connection is an aspect (within a specified orb) between two planets. Sometimes the aspect must be a 'positive' aspect (conjunction, semi-sextile, sextile, or trine), but sometimes it must be a 'negative' aspect (square, quincunx, or opposition). The energies can only flow along like paths. As Kerry has said, "Remember that 'negative' energy flows to 'negative' planets and 'positive' energy flows to 'positive' planets." The definition of a 'positive' planet is a natal planet that makes 'positive' aspects to both the natal Sun and the natal Mercury. The definition of a 'negative' planet is a natal planet that makes 'negative' aspects to both the natal Sun and the natal Mercury.

Here is a pictorial of the energy that is being “sent” and “received” by the various poles (antenna) of the four planets whose positions are given above.



The top four planets in **BLUE** are the four natal planets. The bottom four planets in **MAGENTA** are the four transiting planets. So using four planets gives eight poles. Somehow these planets (their poles) must be interconnected for The Kerry Theory to “work”.

The colored lines in the example represent the various aspects between planets – green is a ‘positive’ aspect, red is a ‘negative’ aspect, and black is any aspect. The thicker lines represent aspects within two degrees of exact, while the thinner lines represent aspects within 15 degrees of exact.

So what connections do we have?

Natal (n.) Saturn makes a ‘positive’ aspect to both n. Sun and n. Mercury.

N. Uranus makes a ‘positive’ aspect to both n. Sun and n. Mercury.

Transiting (t.) Sun makes an aspect to n. Mercury (here is a Mercury Sun – Connection).

The fact that both natal planets are also aspecting both the natal Sun and natal Mercury, both with ‘positive’ aspects, means they are also making Mercury Sun – Connections and are thus involved in the pattern.

Continuing,

t. Sun makes a ‘positive’ aspect to n. Uranus.

t. Uranus makes a ‘positive’ aspect to n. Saturn.

t. Saturn makes a ‘positive’ aspect to n. Sun.

t. Mercury makes ‘negative’ aspects to both n. Saturn and n. Uranus.

t. Sun makes a ‘negative’ aspect to n. Saturn.

With regard to the last two aspects being ‘negative’, because both natal Saturn and natal Uranus make ‘positive’ Mercury Sun – Connections, we know that these ‘negative’ aspects do not change the ‘positive’ aspects, but instead, these aspects add energy to the whole connection complex. The more connections, the more energy. The more energy, the bigger the event.

So we can say that one of the rules of the Kerry Theory has been satisfied when the following conditions exist:

RULE #1a ('positive' energy)

- 1) t. Sun aspecting n. Mercury and applying to that aspect **OR** t. Mercury aspecting n. Sun.
- 2) np1 makes 'positive' aspect to n. Sun.
- 3) np1 makes 'positive' aspect to n. Mercury.
- 4) np2 makes 'positive' aspect to n. Sun.
- 5) np2 makes 'positive' aspect to n. Mercury.
- 6) tp1 makes any aspect to n. Sun.
- 7) tp2 makes any aspect to np1.

np1 means natal planet 1, in this case, natal Saturn.

np2 means natal planet 2, in this case, natal Uranus.

tp1 means transiting planet 1, in this case, transiting Saturn.

tp2 means transiting planet 2, in this case, transiting Uranus.

Study this example until you see how all the planets (through one or both of their poles) are interconnected in the Mercury – Sun Connection, which is The Kerry Theory.

Do you see how a planet is "connected" if one or both of his poles are connected to the whole pattern? Step 7 above involves np1. Step 6 above involves tp1. Do you see that if either np1 or tp1 is aspected that that makes planet 1 part of the connection? If one side of a coin is marked or defaced, or if the other side of the coin is marked or defaced, or if both sides of a coin are marked or defaced, then isn't the coin as a whole marked? The same is true of a planet and its poles.
